PREFACE

The Echo Index contains both an author and a subject index to the Augsburg College newspaper, the Echo. The indexes are arranged alphabetically according to the standardized format of the Readers' Guide to Periodical Literature.

The author section of the Index includes writers of news stories, feature articles, letters to the editor, pictorial essays, columns and editorials. Authors' nicknames were generally retained in the Index when proper names could not be ascertained.

The subject section of the Index excludes commercial advertisements, announcements, photographs and want ads. Personal names appear as subjects if persons were 1) featured, 2) quoted frequently, or 3) referred to periodically or substantially in the article. Subject headings were designed primarily in accordance with Readers' Guide principles but were modified, when appropriate, to facilitate user needs.
